## **Helmet Law Facts**

Did you know ..... Relative to the number of registered motorcycles, states with mandatory helmet laws had 13.2% more accidents and 1.9% more fatalities than free-choice states for a 13 year period 1977 to 1989. (Accident & Fatality Statistics analyzed by A.R. Mackenzie, M.D.) From a 1988 "American Motorcyclists Association" report: The national average of motorcycle fatalities per 100 accidents is 2.95. However, states with rider education and no helmet law show the lowest average of only 2.56 deaths, while states with helmet laws but no training have a significantly higher rate of 3.09. According to Bell Helmets Dealers Guide (1986) ".... an incorrectly fitted helmet can do more damage than no helmet at all....and that people will usually buy a helmet that fits too loose as it is more comfortable."
