Good morning... I just wanted to take this time to mention that I will be finishing here soon at Trev Deeley's and retiring by the end of the year.

But more importantly, would like to say how much this Chapter has meant for the Dealership.....and for me over the years.

I started at Deeley's washing bikes and driving the service truck in 1987. And the next year in 1988, a memo went out about a meeting to be held at the 606 East Broadway location at 8pm April 21st, announcing we were going to sponsor a local HOG Chapter for Vancouver, BC.

Back then, meetings were held late and on weeknights, I guess. I was probably told to go pick up some rental chairs, for the meeting needed to be in the small showroom. For whatever reason, I kept a copy of that memo and its here on display.

Trevor Deeley was maybe even there to help explain about HOG, for HOG was 5 years old by then in the United States and had become a pretty big deal. And Fred Deeley Imports, the exclusive distributor back then, wanted to see this in Canada.

People have asked me how did it go and how many people came? The truth is, I cannot remember... for that was so long ago and I was only 25 years old.

But something must have happened, for a Chapter was officially formed that July and has been having monthly meetings and events ever since. It started off slow, but began to grow, especially when we moved in 1996 to 2375 Boundary Road into a brand-new facility, and we had hundreds of members by then.

We would like to thank all the present and past Directors, Officers, Road Captains, volunteers, and members for so many memorable times and all your help. Some people are no longer with us, yet they will always be remembered.

The Chapter helped lead the procession as we were escorted by the Vancouver Police Drill Team from the store to the Deeley Museum in Richmond for Trev Deeley's memorial ride when he passed away in 2002.

Along with Don James, Malcolm Hunter and their families and staff, Dawne Deeley and Senior Executives from Harley-Davidson and Willie G. Davidson and his family, we all rode and sat together for the service.

Also important, is the good work we have done together in the community.

We have supported the Firefighters Burn Camp, Muscular Dystrophy, BCCOM, AIM, Canuck Place, SPCA, The Motorcycle Toy Run, the Lower Mainland Christmas Bureau, The Ride to Live, Basics for Babies, just to name a few.

We even rode out once right onto the 50-yard line at half-time at a BC Lions game... with permission.

OFFICER REPORTS

SAFETY REPORT

TERESA VARTY Safety Officer

As we head into the cooler and wetter months it is time to turn our attention to the safe storage of our motorcycles for winter. We are fortunate that TDMC offers winter storage at a reasonable price. They also have special deals available, so look at their website for details. IF YOU SELF-STORE YOUR BIKE:

Here are 8 tips to prepare your motorcycle to safely ride out the winter:

1. Wash your bike

Give your bike a good wash and dry thoroughly to get all the moisture off. Moisture and damp spots can damage the paint.

Waxing your bike will provide extra protection against moisture and rust.

Spray exposed metal surfaces with WD-40 to prevent rust and corrosion.

2. Fill up your fuel tank

Filling up helps prevent the inner lining of your tank from corroding.

To keep the gas from deteriorating and to avoid rust in the gas tank, add the recommended amount of fuel stabilizer to your tank.

Turn on your bike and let it run for a few minutes so the treated fuel can cycle through.

3. Check your fluids

Double-check your brake, clutch, and coolant fluids before storage. Top up your antifreeze if you're not storing your bike in a climate-controlled space.

Lube your throttle, kickstand, shifter, and clutch cables to avoid rust and moisture.

4. Replace your oil

Change your oil and filter before storing your bike to avoid corrosion. It's better for your lubrication system to have fresh oil sitting in it.

5. Pump up your tires

Fill your tires to their maximum recommended volume. Check that there are no leaks in the tires.

To prevent flat spots from forming while in storage, use a motorcycle stand to store your bike with the tires off the ground. If you don't have a stand, then try to get at least the rear tire off the ground so you can roll your

bike back and forth from time to time to rotate your tires over the winter.

Keep moisture from seeping into your tires by placing a piece of carpet or plywood under them.

6. Plug your pipes

Your exhaust pipe should not become a winter home for local wildlife. Plug your air intake and exhaust with towels or plastic bags to keep critters out.

7. Remove your battery

A simple way to safeguard your battery from self-discharging over the winter is to remove it.

8. Cover up

After prepping your bike, store it underneath a motorcycle cover to keep dust off and moisture out.
